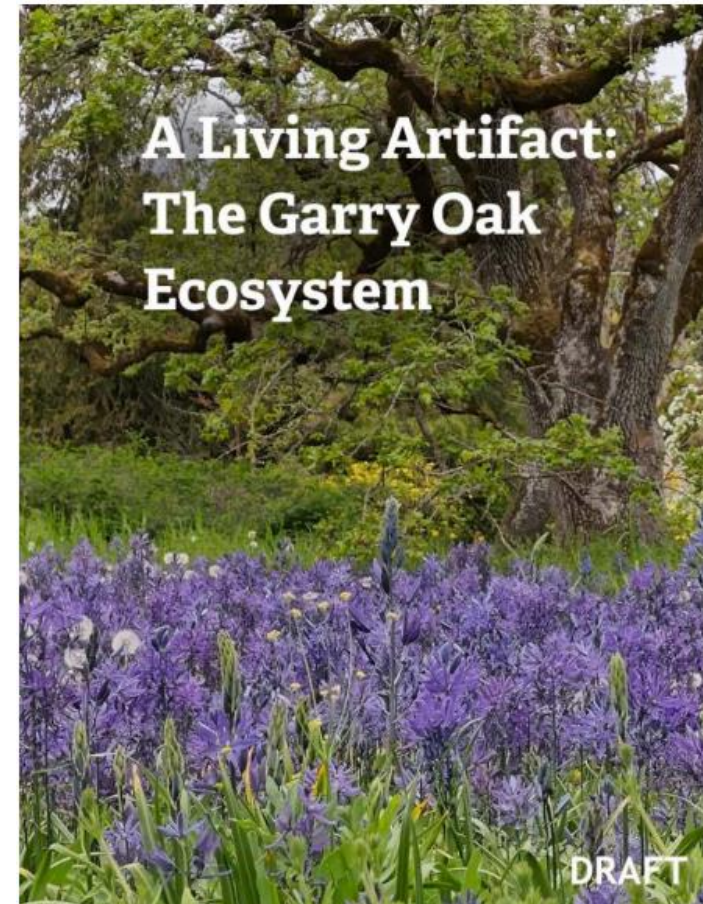
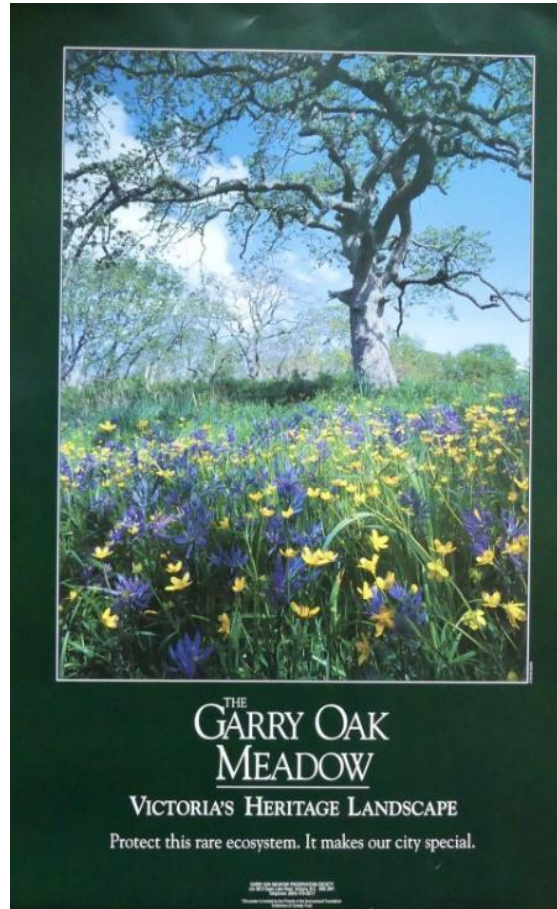

Garry Oak Ecosystem Facts

- >> Garry oak ecosystems (GOE) arrived after the glacial retreat approximately 10,000 years ago
- >> GOE within Canada only occur in British Columbia.
- >> GOE are among the most endangered ecosystems in Canada with an estimated only three percent remaining in a natural state.
- >> Continuously declining, largely due to urban development.
- >> GOE is a **BIODIVERSITY HOT SPOT**
At least 1,645 organisms (plants, insects, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals, etc.) have co-evolved with GOE.



ĆEN_ lĆĆ, Garry oak

- >> SENĆOTEN word for Garry oak: Chung-ae-th-ch
- >> **Kwetal (Camas) Food System** or
Garry oak ecosystem shaped by Indigenous agroecological management over thousands of years.
(Barlow et al, 2021; Beckwith, 2005; Fuchs, 2001)
- >> Garry oaks connect the ləkʷəŋən and W_SÁNEĆ people with their lands, traditions, foods, medicines, cultural practices, and ancestors.

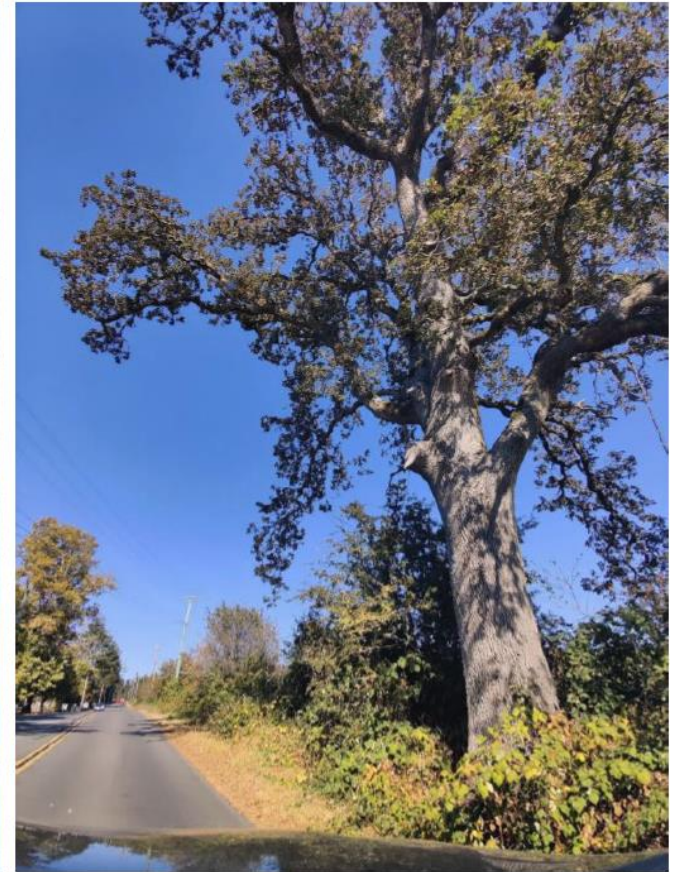

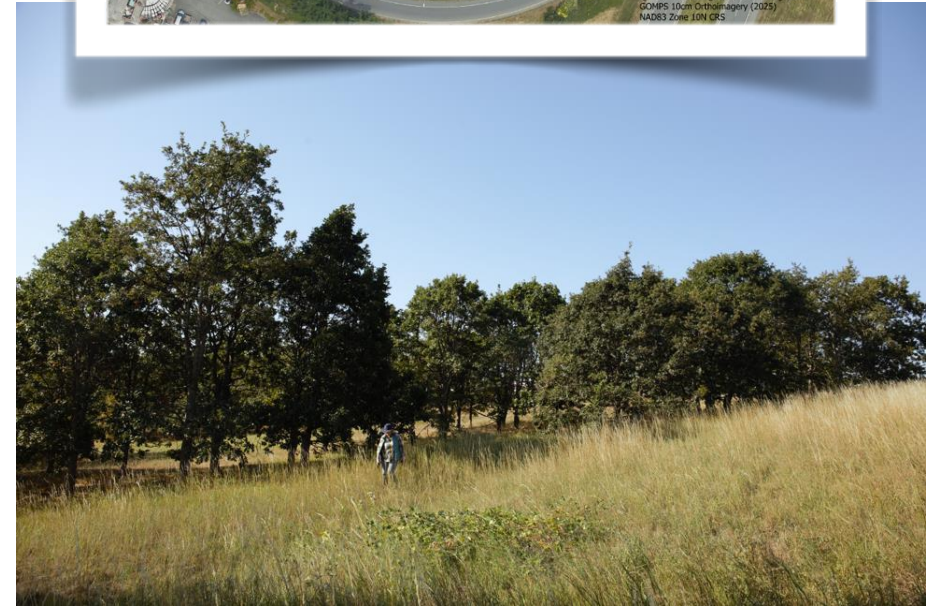
30 Year Re-measurement of the Quadra Overpass

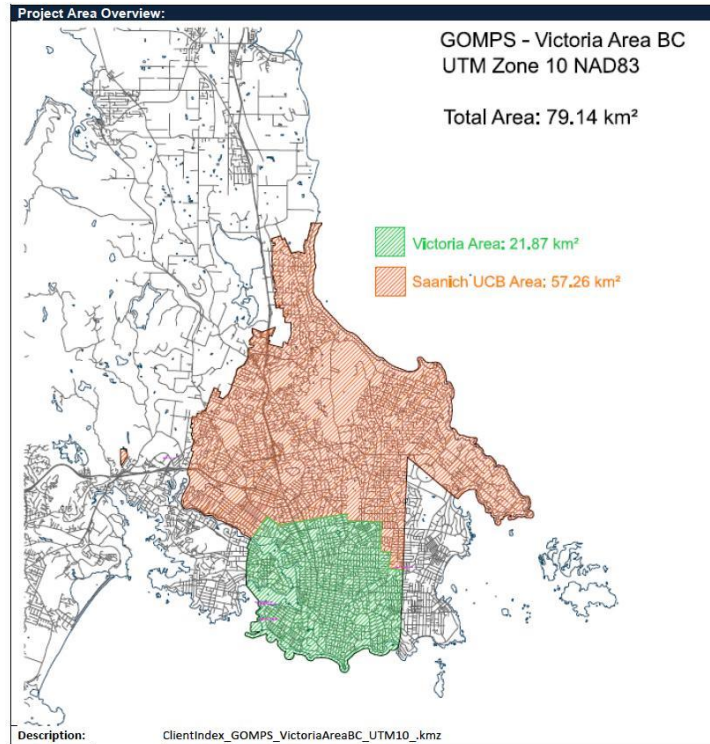

Remote Sensing: Garry Oak Species Detection Project



Building strong evidence: Access to public high-resolution data is limited. Community organizations have limited information to advocate for Garry oak protection and stewardship. FOCUS on private property not measured until now.



UBC Capstone Project: Garry oak species detection analysis tool - GOMPS, UBC, and Terra Remote Sensing



- Mapping and analysis of the overall Garry oak ecosystem and individual trees in the Capital Regional District is out of date.
- LiDAR is a cost-effective, high-accuracy method of forest analysis that enables measurements such as change to tree populations through intensifying land development.
- New approach to map Garry oak species presence using LiDAR and machine learning.
- Form a species composition baseline to enable future analysis.
- Contribute to a growing body of regional urban forest mapping that could influence changes in tree protection policies (e.g., enhanced existing tree protections and requirements for Garry oak replacement trees through private development), and management and planning for Garry oaks on public property.
